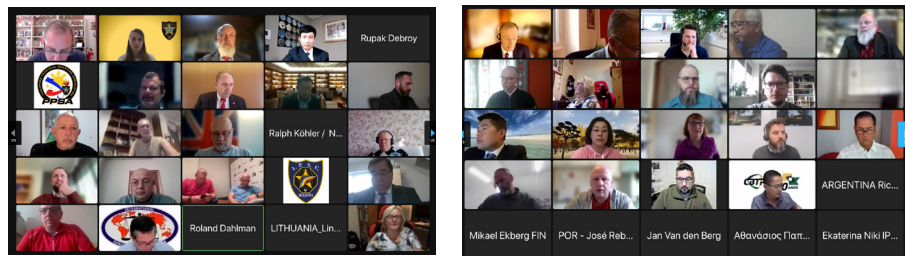
IPSC In Full Motion!

Dear Friends,

As we move through this year, I am pleased to share with you some news.

We started the year actively and have already held the Extraordinary General Assembly (EGA) on March 31, 2023. The Assembly was mainly focused on discussing the proposed Rules amendments deferred from the 2022 General Assembly.

I express my gratitude for the work done by the Rules Committee and of the Athletes' Committee, all Regional Directors and IROA, who took an active part in the discussion of the amendments, expressed their reasoned opinions and recommendations for the formation of effective proposals and necessary amendments.



Specifically, for that, an online forum was created by IPSC HQ to discuss all amendments to the rules. Regional Directors and members of IPSC Committees could publish their comments and proposals about existing motions there. Additional online meetings were held to clarify all issues related to the rules, and thanks to this, the General Assembly was able to quickly and effectively make progressive decisions.

Among many different subjects discussed, the following rules amendments were approved by the Assembly:

- Handgun Production Optics Light Division was deleted.
- Action Air PCC and Rifle Disciplines were approved.

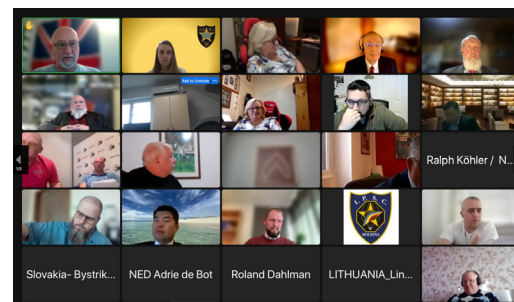
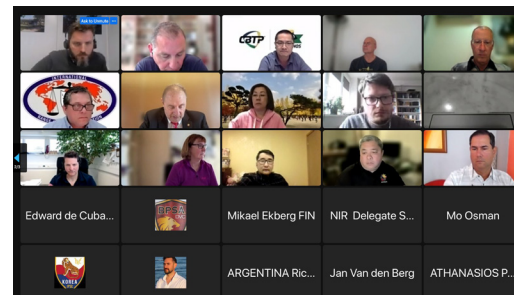

- .22LR Handgun was adopted as a new IPSC Discipline as part of a Junior Program.
- Grand Senior was ratified as the name of the new Category of shooters from the age of 70.
- Lady Senior Category added. Competitors of the female gender who are over the age of 50 on the first day of the match.
- IPSC Pistol Caliber Carbine Competition Rules were amended.
- IPSC Micro targets were adopted for PCC, Rifle and Action Air.
- The proposal to limit the weight of the magazine base pads in the Handgun Production Divisions was NOT approved.
- Proposals to permit aftermarket triggers and hammers without restriction in the Handgun Production Divisions were approved.



All the approved Rules amendments came into effect on April 01, 2023. All the Rule Books April 2023 are published at the IPSC web page: <https://www.ipsc.org/ipsc-rules/rule-books/>

Other subjects discussed included the following:

- PCC/MR World Shoot was postponed to 2025.
- Feeling of the Assembly was positive towards moving the African Handgun Championship from 2025 to 2024 and will be conducted at the same range as HWS2025.

In addition, I am pleased to announce cooperation with Dillon Precision in the status of being a new IPSC Official Major Partner in the field of 'IPSC Reloading'. Dillon Precision has been actively involved in the development of IPSC sport for many years, creating advanced Reloading Equipment and Machines for the IPSC Athletes and is actively involved in supporting the best IPSC Athletes. We appreciate it and look forward to reinforcing our mutual cooperation for the benefit of our sports and athletes.



In 2023, together with the IPSC Greece and IPSC Thailand regions, we are preparing for two big L4 and L5 matches – the European Handgun Championship (24-30 September in Corinth, Greece) and the Shotgun World Shoot IV (2-10 December in Pattaya, Thailand). Regions are already actively preparing everything necessary to once again welcome athletes from all over the world to their shooting ranges. IPSC Saudi Arabia

Saudi Arabia, officially the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (KSA), covers the bulk of the Arabian Peninsula, and is the fifth-largest country in Asia, the second-largest in the Arab world, and the largest in Western Asia and the Middle East.

Its capital and largest city of Riyadh is the home of the Prince Faisal Bin Fahd Olympic Shooting Complex, the official headquarters of IPSC Saudi Arabia.

The country is home to Mecca and Medina, the two holiest cities in Islam.

Under the guidance of H.H Prince Saud Khaled Alsaud, the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia is one of IPSC's newest Regions; however, in its relatively short but vibrant life, it has grown from a modest 42 members at the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic to an impressive 214 headcount, and more members are joining every week!

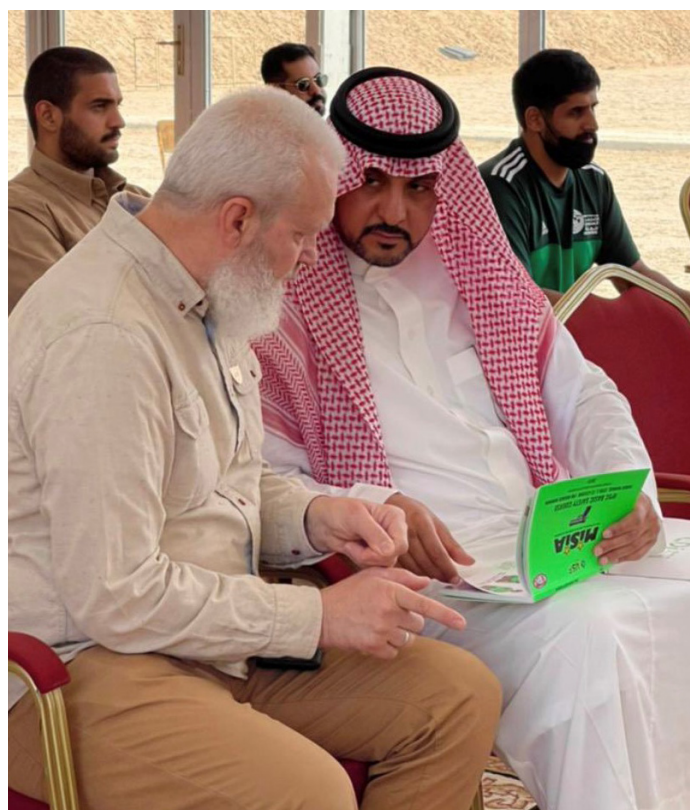

IPSC Saudi Arabia was accepted under Provisional status in the 2021 General Assembly and granted full recognition in the 2022 General Assembly in Pattaya, Thailand. In addition, the Region has actively been participating in MISIA trainings and graduated 12 MISIA Instructors to date. There are also IROA Seminars planned to take place in the near future.

The Region counts with two (2) Practical Shooting active teams: one team for ladies and one team for men. In a recent visit to the Region, IPSC President Mr. Vitaly Kryuchin witnessed the high importance its authorities invest in gun safety, training and development.

In addition, Saudi Arabia has two shooting clubs and over 17 new shooting ranges either completed or near completion throughout the region, fully equipped to conduct IPSC matches.



The Kingdom of Saudi Arabia allows firearm ownership (handguns, shotguns and rifles) for the purpose of hunting and target shooting to any Saudi 18-years of age or older.

The government recognition to the sport of Practical Shooting is provided by the Saudi Shooting Federation.

By looking forward to a promising and fruitful shooting year 2023, IPSC Saudi Arabia is proud to be among the amazing and engaging IPSC family and can't wait to see you on the range in the near future!

IPSC Saudi Arabia By The Numbers

How many members does your Region have?

We started right after the COVID-19 pandemic with 42 members, and we have increased our membership to 214 active members to date.

How many Levels 1-2-3 matches you conduct per year?

We usually have around 6 to 8 matches per year.

How many gun clubs are there in your Region?

The Saudi Shooting Federation's facility is the only active club as it has a plan of expanding and developing new facilities in the upcoming years.

How many ROs, MISIA (IPSC) Instructors and Trainers reside in your Region?

There are 32 ROs in our Region and 12 MISIA Instructors.





CHILE WELCOMES MISIA SEMINARS

From September 30th to October 3rd 2022, two MISIA Seminars - Level 1 Instructors Handgun Seminar and Level 2 Trainers Seminar in Spanish - were successfully held in Chile.

The Seminars took place in the shooting club Talkan near Santiago (Chile) and gathered together about 30 participants.

Instructors and Trainers were certified to train athletes in the Region. Seven participants did not pass the shooting test and were sent for retraining for the next test.

Members of the Board of IPSC Chile, led by Regional Director Felipe Soriano and MISIA Director Felipe Brandt, took part in the seminars and passed the shooting tests successfully.



One of the participants, IPSC athlete Carlos Ríos who trains practical shooting regularly, took the Instructor Seminar and shared his attitude towards practical shooting, saying: “practical shooting saved my life”.

Another participant, Lucas Kraglievich, traveled 1,400 km from Argentina to Chile to take part in the MISIA Instructors’ Seminar.

MISIA expresses gratitude to the Chilean Region for the assistance in the preparation of the Seminars and congratulate all participants on completing all the training successfully!

About Dillon Precision

The growth and development of Dillon Precision Products, Inc. paralleled the growth and development of the practical shooting sports. The International Practical Shooting Confederation was founded in May 1976 and Dillon Precision in September 1977. Our contribution to the sport was to make it possible to train more without the expense of buying factory ammunition or spending untold hours loading ammunition on a single stage reloading press. Reloading made shooting affordable for more competitors, which encouraged the growth of the sport.

Mike Dillon got into the reloading business by accident, having inherited a Thompson Submachine Gun and a Star Machine Works reloader from a friend who died in a tragic airplane crash. Mike discovered reloading as a means of feeding the hungry Thompson and after acquiring an M16 rifle, he wanted a way to load .223 ammunition as well.

Eyeing the Star reloader, he believed he could adapt it to load the rifle cartridge, even though the manufacturer said it would not. As the story goes, Mike said they sold him a .380 shellplate and wished him "good luck."

That was the beginning of Mike's venture into the reloading-equipment business, and after selling around 100 of his first product, the "Super Star Conversion," some of his fellow machinegun enthusiasts encouraged him to design a machine that would load .30-06 ammunition for their belt-fed guns.

The Rapid Load 1000 (RL1000) was the result: an expensive, custom-built machine Mike intended to market to commercial reloaders, machine-gun enthusiasts, and gun shops. Realizing that market was limited, Mike wanted next to create a "hobby level" reloader he could mass produce. The machines that followed – RL300, RL450, RL550, RL1050, Square Deal, RL450 Jr., and the XL650 – were the progenitors of our current line-up, all of which reflect Mike's original vision of high-quality reloading equipment that's affordable and easy to use.

Mike believed that a company is only as good as its customer support, and that happy customers are the best advertising. Mike once said, "I run the company based on my philosophy. You treat other people the way you want to be treated. I don't want people calling me up saying, 'You miserable S.O.B., you sold me this machine and now you won't help me.' I don't want anyone mad at me. This is reflected in our warranty....Whether you are the first owner, or the seventeenth, all our hobby-level reloading machines have a lifetime warranty."

All in all, our mission is to continue to design and produce exceptional reloading equipment and accessories, provide the best customer service and warranty support in the reloading industry, and promote the continued growth of the shooting sports. Our partnership with IPSC is a fundamental element of Mike Dillon's legacy.

How did you first hear about IPSC?

I have been following my father in shooting since I was a child, spending every weekend with him at the shooting range and he was always talking about IPSC shooting.

For how long have you been shooting?

I first tried shooting back in 2017. From that moment, I felt an adrenaline rush and I decided to take an exam for safe handling of firearms so I could start shooting. After the exam, I was shooting sporadically, without taking it seriously. When I saw that I was getting the hang of it, I deepened and started training seriously. In 2019, my dad bought me my first gun to use it in my first shooting season.

After the first season, I became more enthusiastic about the sport, and was increasingly motivated to do as much and as well as possible. In 2020 I bought a new pistol and used it for one season. My current



coach, Robert Ćernigoj saw the potential in me, and with his company »Cesar Shop«, he helps me and helped me sponsor the BUL pistol which I used for shooting this season. I am especially grateful to Robert, because I learned a lot from him and also have made great progress. He is my biggest role model and one day I would like to be an European Champion or even a World Champion.

What division do you shoot and why?

I shoot Open Division because it's a lot more fun for me.

What is the coolest about IPSC shooting?

This sport is fun and adrenaline-filled. I like that because it is not a sport where you use only the body, but also the mind. When you are not on the track with your head, mistakes will surely be made and so the points will be taken away.

What do your friends and family think about you shooting IPSC?

My father was my first biggest inspiration. Many times he would be absent, and I wanted to spend more time with him. I didn't expect the shooting to impress me so much. I can say that this sport has connected me more with my father.

What are the biggest challenges you have when shooting IPSC?

I work in a kindergarten and have a lot of meetings and seminars. Because of that, I have less time for training which I compensate by doing fry fire at home.

What other sport(s) do you think help with IPSC shooting?

I believe that, by training in disciplines like fitness, crossfit, bootcamp etc., you can get fit and gain more endurance in the competition, be it long or short. Also working a lot on strength, these workouts can help you move faster, start stronger, firmer pistol grip, etc.

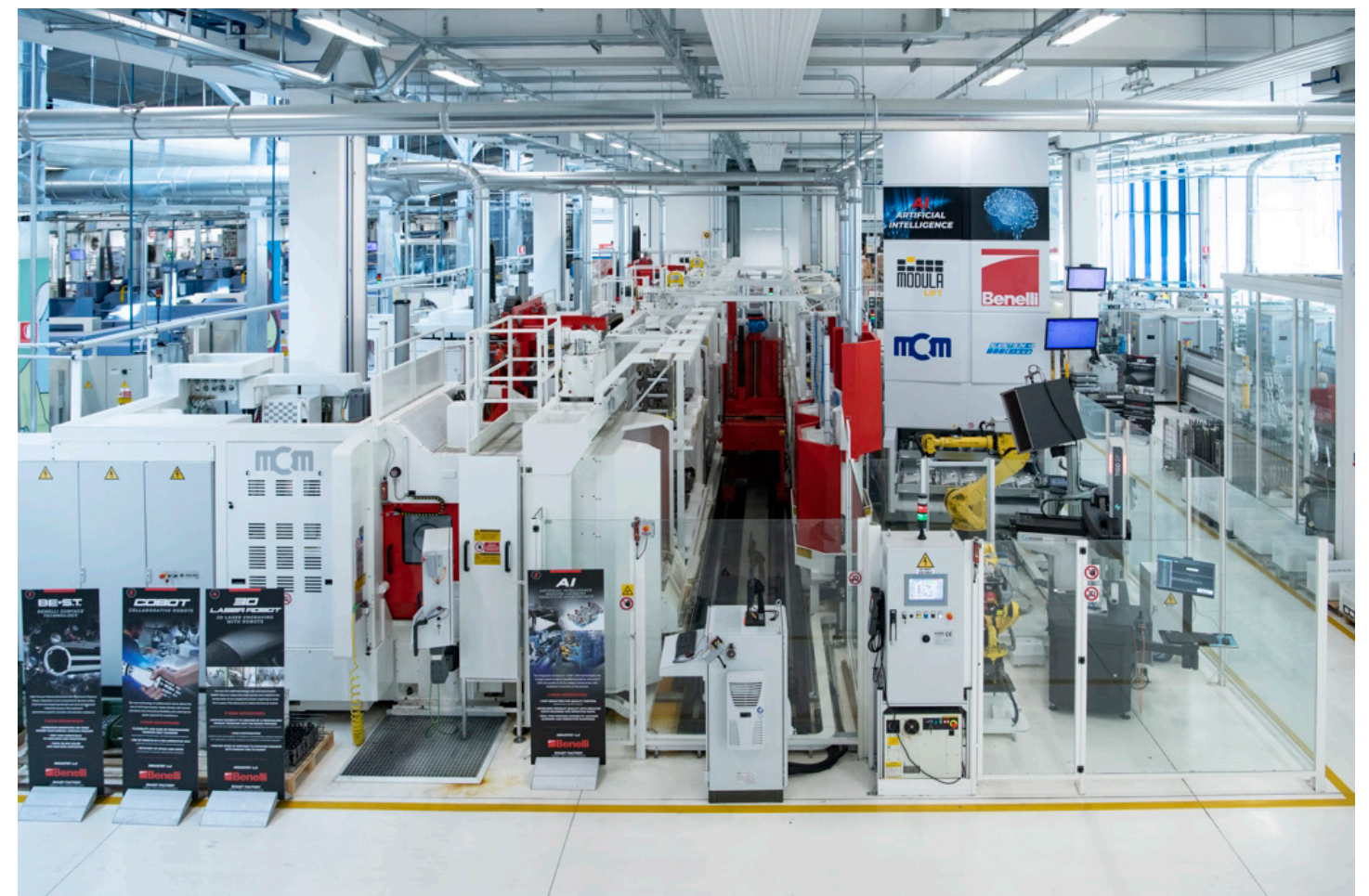
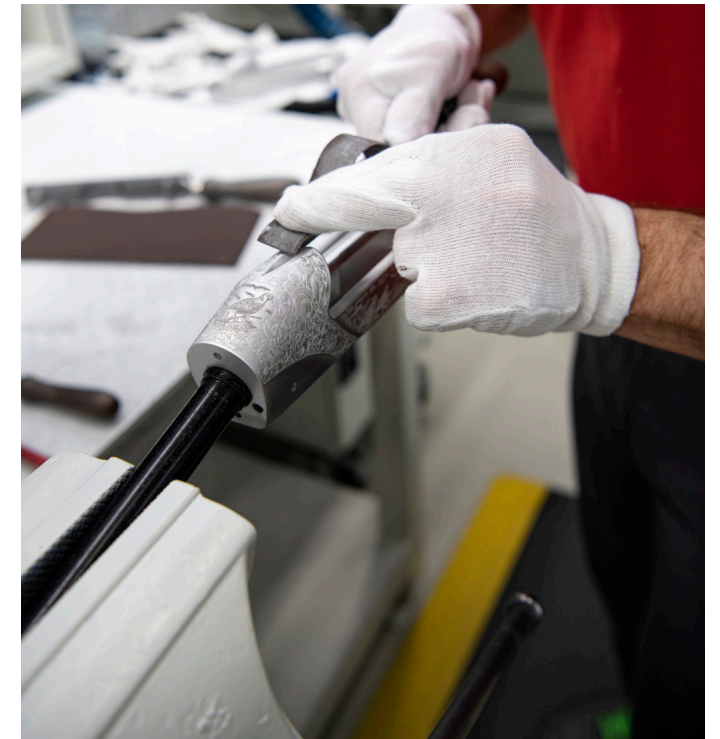

German Romitelli

REGION: Argentina

How many years have you been shooting?
I started shooting from a very young age, at 13 years old, but for some years I did not shoot and in 2011 I took up this sport completely and since that year I have dedicated myself to training.

What do you like best about IPSC shooting?
The adrenaline that you feel during the competitions is what I enjoy the most about this sport. Having a single opportunity to run the stages is something that makes it very challenging and exciting.

How often do you practice at the range?
In the polygon I train at least 3 times a week but in times of important competitions that training goes up to 5 or 6 times a week.



Who do you consider your inspiration or mentor?
As a work inspiration, Eric Grauffel has always been a reference for me. I followed the 2011 World Shoot in Greece online because I hadn't shot yet and it was a great inspiration for me as an athlete and shooter. An Argentine shooter named Prieto Marcelo is also an inspiration and today he is a great friend and reference for me.

And as a mentor who taught me the basics of this sport and how to train it, I'd name Federico Pastor, another excellent Argentine shooter.

What is your match pistol and ammo?
Since I started shooting, I always shoot with CZ firearms. Today, I shoot with CZ SHADOW 2 ORANGE and the ammunition I use is ammunition reloaded by my father with Argentine national supplies. I use 14 gns bullets.

How do you unwind at the end of the day?
A good way to relax at the end of the day is by cooking a delicious dinner and having an excellent wine.

How do you prepare mentally for a match?
Mentally I think it is the most difficult part of this sport and it is the one that challenges me the most to improve. I work with a sports psychologist but I also believe that the best way to mentally prepare is by competing in as many competitions as possible.

Any special exercises?
I train a lot. I have a physical trainer who helps me with that aspect. In addition to training in a gym, I have the possibility of training the physical part on the range and combining it with shooting.

Are you active in any other sport?
Not currently, but for 15 years I played basketball and for some years I did both sports simultaneously.

What advice do you have for up and coming shooters?
Be patient. Practical shooting takes many years of training and it is a long process to be able to assimilate all the aspects of this beautiful sport. Patience and constant training are the key.

When and where did you first discover IPSC shooting?

I started shooting in 1993 when a good friend of mine invited me to compete in minor matches until I realized that I wanted to be more competitive. I got better equipment, rigs and tools and went to Manila to learn more from coach Jojo Naranjilla so we compete more often in and out of the country with the support of PB Dionisio Gun Club and Magnus Sports.

What inspired you to begin shooting?

I have loved guns since I was a kid. I loved hunting and plinking 22 rifles and cleaning my uncle's guns. In addition, my family has been in the gun business since the 60's (firearm dealer) here in Philippines.

Which divisions do you shoot, and why?

I started shooting Open Division in 1993, and in 1996 I shot my very first World Shoot in Brazil. I have then shot Modified Division in 2002, Production Division in 2005 and back to Open Division in 2008. In 2011 World Shoot Greece I shot Modified Division, then Classic Division

in 2014 and now I am shooting Production Optics and won Senior Overall during the last World Shoot in Pattaya. I prefer shooting with optics in a Production gun, less hassle for me and not too complicated.

Which make and model firearm do you use?

Open Division: SPS and STI 38super
Modified Division: SPS and STI 40 caliber
Classic Division: STI and Armscor 40caliber
Production Division: Glock and CZ Shadow 9mm
Production Optics Division: CZ Shadow 2 Optic Ready 9mm with Leupold Delta Point 7moa.

What other sports or activities do you also enjoy?

Aside from practical shooting, I do Precision Pistol Shooting (ISSF).

What do your friends and family think about you shooting IPSC?

They're supportive, specially our mom Romeliza (sibling Jeufro Jag Lejano). She's very supportive ever

since we started. My brother Jag Lejano is the reigning Classic World Champion now and we've been shooting since 1992. My fiancée Christine and my son Jvan are also into shooting so it's a family affair every weekend and we're enjoying it very much. A lot of friends are also into shooting.

Always BE SAFE, that should always be first. Try to find a great coach to begin with, to develop a strong foundation specially in basic shooting, bad habits are hard to adjust or neaten, so choose the right mentor. Discipline and enjoy the sport, do the right basics.

How long have you been shooting?

Which division do you shoot, and why?

Who and/or what inspired you to begin IPSC shooting?

What tips do you have for other aspiring female IPSC competitors?

Since the sport is mostly men, it makes it hard for women to go top of the class. But if you practice hard enough winning is easy! And I already proved that!

The unofficial dates will be check on Monday November 27 check out Sunday December 10.

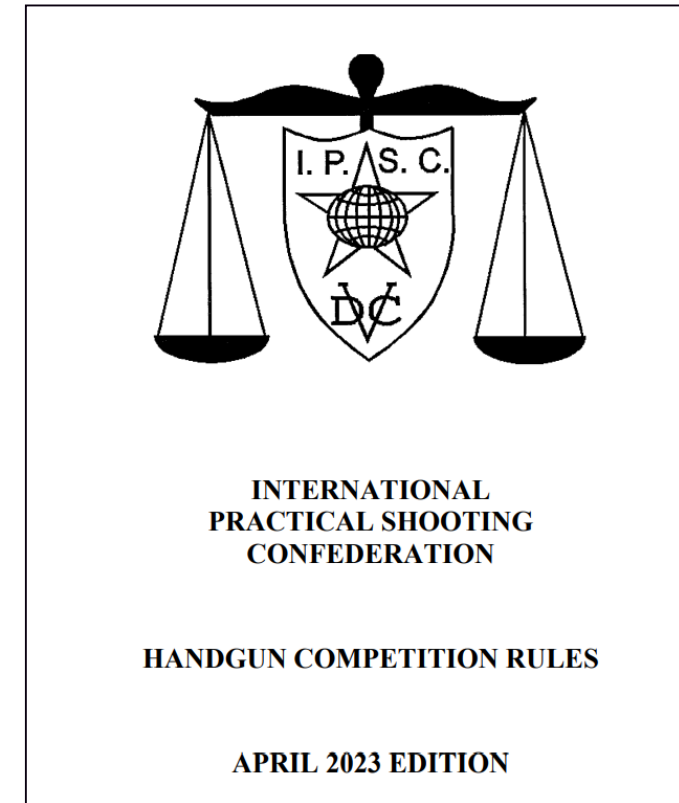
Level II IROA Shotgun Seminar will be November 26/27.

The trigger reset has also been shortened to the maximum and the barrel is highly polished.

Putting the new CZ TS 2 ORANGE under the microscope

Introduced at the end of 2022, the CZ TS 2 ORANGE is already dominating the IPSC Standard division.
